ANDERSON'S CROSS COUNTRY ADVENTURE CONTINUES THIS WEEKEND

"With little time to relax, Indy Lights pilot, Scott Anderson heads from the sun-soaked beachfront of Long Beach, California to the tree-lined rolling hills of Birmingham, Alabama."



Fort Collins, Colorado - Scott Anderson, driver of the #77 Schmidt Peterson Motorsports Indy Lights car had only a couple of days to unpack and repack his luggage as he and his team head to Barber Motorsports Park, located just north of Birmingham, Alabama. This weekend will

mark the first road course for the 2015 Indy Lights Championship powered by Cooper Tires after three rounds on two temporary street courses. The back-to-back weekends on vastly different tracks will be a big test of drivers and teams.

"We made some decent progress at Long Beach," lamented Anderson. "It's still not the qualifying we needed to really be competitive up front in the race, but we're moving in the right direction. The race was pretty hectic, a lot of carnage, that luckily I was able to avoid. I managed to climb back to sixth from eighth after a spin early on. It wasn't a great result but I'm glad the pace was there."



Barber Motorsports Park will challenge drivers with 2.3 miles and 17 turns of flowing asphalt with loads of fast sweeping corners and plenty of elevation change. Referred to as the Augusta National of North American racetracks, the grounds are beautifully manicured with several terraced viewing areas. It's a race fans racetrack for sure.

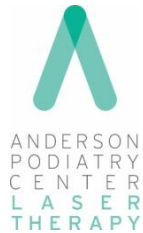
"After these first two street tracks it will be great to race at Barber," said Anderson with a smile. "Our test there was rained out, so I haven't been on a proper high speed road course in the new car yet - I'm excited to see what we can do. We really need to pick up where we left off at Long Beach and keep chipping away."

Anderson and the #77 Anderson Podiatry Centers, Indy Lights entry, with support from Hull and Knarr, LLP, will hit the Iron City on April 24th - 26th for two full rounds of racing.

An expert skier and avid outdoor enthusiast, the Fort Collins, Colorado resident is on the third and final step of the Mazda Road To Indy. Anderson was the recipient of the MAZDASPEED Motorsports Development Scholarship after winning the 2011 BFGoodrich/Skip Barber National Championship Presented by Mazda. In 2012, Anderson competed in the Cooper Tires USF2000 Championship powered by Mazda winning two races. In 2013, Scott raced in the ProMazda Championship Presented by Cooper Tires with Juncos Racing. In 2014, Anderson completed his rookie season in Indy Lights with Fan Force United. For 2015, Scott enters his sophomore season in Indy Lights with a new team; Schmidt Peterson Motorsports. He is also a member of the Derek Daly Academy led by former Formula One driver Derek Daly.
