ANDERSON FOCUSED ON PODIUM RESULTS TO CLOSE OUT SEASON

Fort Collins, Colorado - Scott Anderson, driver of the #77 Schmidt Peterson Motorsports Indy Lights car heads into the final weekend of the 2015 Indy Lights Championship sitting eighth in the overall championship standings. With so many new elements coming into the season, Scott has adapted well to the new car and new engine package that will set the direction of Indy Car's feeder series for the future. At the most recent double-header round held at the Mid-Ohio Sports Car Course, Anderson was able to build some solid momentum taking seventh and eighth in the two rounds of racing. In race two, Scott set fastest lap of the race while moving through traffic.



"I've had some pretty terrible luck this last part of the season," reflects Scott. "We were the fastest car on track at Mid-Ohio, so we definitely have the speed on road courses after working on that all season. The focus now is just keeping that speed every time we're on track."

The entire Mazda Road to Indy program will descend on the 2.24 mile, 11 turn Mazda Raceway Laguna Seca to complete the final two races in all three classes and crown three new champions. With so much on the line and several drivers in the hunt for the Indy Lights title, look for Anderson to take advantage.

"I'm very glad to be going back to Mazda Raceway," comments Anderson. "it might be my favorite track and I've had a lot of success there so I hope to continue that trend this weekend to close out the season. Being the last race of the season I really need to end it on a high note. If we can do that I think we have a very good chance of a much needed podium."

The #77 Anderson Podiatry Centers, with support from Hull & Knarr, LLP, Indy Lights powered by Cooper Tires Championship entry is on track Thursday for two Promoter test sessions. Friday delivers two practice sessions with qualifying and Race One held on Saturday. Sunday will host the second feature race of the double-header weekend of racing.

An expert skier and avid outdoor enthusiast, the Fort Collins, Colorado resident is on the third and final step of the Mazda Road To Indy. Anderson was the recipient of the MAZDASPEED Motorsports Development Scholarship after winning the 2011 BFGoodrich/Skip Barber National Championship Presented by Mazda. In 2012, Anderson competed in the Cooper Tires USF2000 Championship powered by Mazda winning two races. In 2013, Scott raced in the ProMazda Championship Presented by Cooper Tires with Juncos Racing. In 2014, Anderson completed his rookie season in Indy Lights with Fan Force United. For 2015, Scott enters his sophomore season in Indy Lights with a new team; Schmidt Peterson Motorsports.
