ANDERSON LOOKING TO CARRY BARBER MOMENTUM INTO MONTH OF MAY

"Busy opening half of Indy Lights season continues this weekend with a double header on the Indianapolis Motor Speedway road course."



Fort Collins, Colorado - Scott Anderson, driver of the #77 Schmidt Peterson Motorsports Indy Lights car is very excited to get to the Indianapolis Motor Speedway this week to keep up the strong momentum he had in race two at Barber Motorsports Park. While race one turned into a

test session after opening lap contact put Scott several laps down, race two showed the true pace of his Anderson Podiatry Centers with support from Hull & Knarr LLP, entry.

"Getting taken out in the first race was definitely frustrating but that kind of thing happens," commented Anderson. "Luckily the SPM guys did an amazing job getting the car fixed and back out quickly, and we were able to complete enough laps to still get points. We basically used the rest of the race as a test session. Sunday went much better, making it up to fourth from seventh at the start and finishing fifth was a good result considering how hard it is to pass at Barber. It's definitely a place you can spend the entire race trying to get around somebody, so I'm happy that wasn't the case."



Manager, Derek Daly was pleased with the progress and had this to say: "This was Scott's most competitive weekend yet. He is doing exactly what he's being asked to do by the team. With each race weekend, Scott gets faster and faster. He's on a steep learning curve having never run the same car in each of his five racing seasons. I'm looking for more growth and more speed this weekend at Indy."

From the rolling hills of Barber, the 2015 Cooper Tires Indy Lights Championship heads to the flat, fast confines of the IMS Grand Prix Circuit. Two long straights are tied together with several technical sections that make up the 2.439 mile, 14-turn road course. The track is unique in that it uses some of the famous oval, some of the inner access roads and some sections used only this weekend giving a real mix of track surface conditions.

"The Indianapolis Grand Prix should be a great event, continues Anderson. "We did well there last year and I really want some good results on a road course before we switch to ovals. I think

we've shown we have a very competitive race pace, but it's still just a matter of qualifying up front. If we can qualify well, we should easily be fighting for podiums."

Anderson and the #77 Anderson Podiatry Centers Indy Lights entry, with support from Hull & Knarr, LLP, will hit the Speedway on Wednesday, May 6th for a Promoters Test Day, with Thursday, May 7th set for one day of practice, followed by qualifying and race one on Friday, May 8th and race two on Saturday, May 9th.

An expert skier and avid outdoor enthusiast, the Fort Collins, Colorado resident is on the third and final step of the Mazda Road To Indy. Anderson was the recipient of the MAZDASPEED Motorsports Development Scholarship after winning the 2011 BFGoodrich/Skip Barber National Championship Presented by Mazda. In 2012, Anderson competed in the Cooper Tires USF2000 Championship powered by Mazda winning two races. In 2013, Scott raced in the ProMazda Championship Presented by Cooper Tires with Juncos Racing. In 2014, Anderson completed his rookie season in Indy Lights with Fan Force United. For 2015, Scott enters his sophomore season in Indy Lights with a new team; Schmidt Peterson Motorsports.
