"Rookie Indy Lights driver focused on recovering from tough opening round as he makes his first appearance at the historic Grand Prix of Long Beach."

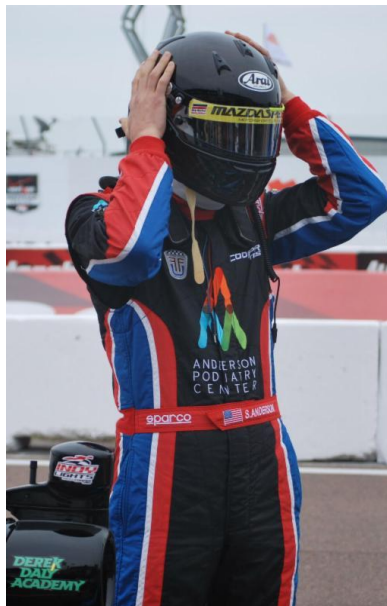


Fort Collins, Colorado - Scott Anderson, extreme sport enthusiast and race winning Road to Indy athlete, is happy to have the Sunshine State in his rear view mirror as he and the crew of Fan Force United prepare to head west for round two of the 2014 Cooper Tires Indy Lights Championship. Following a great start from his fifth place starting spot in the Sunday round one feature race, Anderson made contact with the wall, ending his day just two laps into the race.

This weekend's trek to the Golden State gives Anderson a chance at redemption and an opportunity to showcase the speed the Fan Force United #24 Indy Lights car has shown so far this season.

"It's been a busy week for us getting the car ready for Long Beach after a big crash in St. Pete. The crash was unfortunate as we were looking to be in great shape for the race," comments Anderson from Indianapolis. "On my part, it was a mistake and I think a bit of a wake up call for me to realize that you do have to be much more aware of car placement on street circuits. An inch might have made all the difference. All I can do is take what I learned and apply it to Long Beach, and try to be even stronger there."

The Fan Force United crew has been hard at work getting the #24 Anderson Podiatry Centers; Laser Therapy, Surgery, and Neuropathy car ready for the long trip to Long Beach, California. Anderson will again face a tight, narrow concrete lined street circuit. The historic 1.97-mile circuit will see the 40th year of action as the 11-turn course takes drivers along Shoreline Drive.



"We pretty much had to build a whole car," continues Anderson. "We got it done and now we are headed out to California. As bad as you could say St. Pete was, I think there were a ton of positives we got out of it. We made a lot of progress on the setup, the car's feeling good and we were making steady progress during practice. We've made good use of the time we have had and my engineer and I are working great together. I'm really looking forward to continuing the progress in Long Beach. We've got a good handle on our street circuit setup, I'm feeling good in the car and it's definitely one of the coolest races we get to run."

The Cooper Tires Indy Lights Championship will again run with the Verizon IndyCar Series as they do throughout the entire 2014 season. Cars hit the track on Friday with one practice session. Saturday sees another practice session followed by qualifying. Sunday racing action will have cars line up for round two of the 14 round Road to Indy championship.

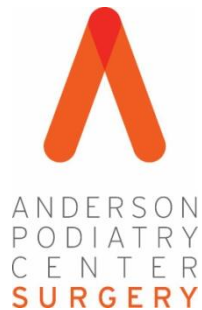
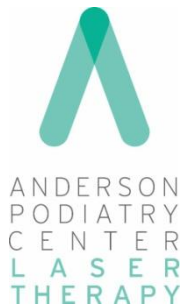
