



## MAPPING A CAREER ALONG THE ROAD TO INDY

*Colorado-born motorsports athlete takes a route less traveled in search of success at the top of American open wheel racing*

Scott Anderson, extreme sport enthusiast and race winning Road to Indy athlete, is not your average driver looking to make it in big time car racing. With a goal of winning the Indy 500, Anderson is focused and perfectly positioned to take on his dreams. An expert skier and avid outdoor enthusiast, the Fort Collins, Colorado resident is on the third and final step of the Mazda Road to Indy as he enters his sophomore season of Indy Lights presented by Cooper Tires. Scott has joined multi-time series champions, Schmidt Peterson Racing, for 2015 in his chase for the championship.

2014 was best described as a 'big ask' for Anderson as he moved to the venerable Indy Lights Series after just one season of Pro Mazda competition. Running with the series veteran team of Fan Force United, Anderson took on a steep learning curve as he grabbed onto the higher horsepower machines that have developed so many of today's Verizon IndyCar Series stars. Gaining speed and confidence as the season progressed, Scott made his debut at the Indianapolis Motor Speedway in May running on the historic 2.5 mile oval in the Freedom 100. Running at speeds of nearly 200 mph, Anderson could see his dream closer than ever.

Just five years into his Road to Indy journey, Anderson has found much success in that short period of time. In 2013, Scott raced in the Pro Mazda Championship Presented by Cooper Tires with Juncos Competition and again stood on the podium. In 2012, Anderson finished third in the Cooper Tires USF2000 Championship powered by Mazda, winning two races and setting a new lap record at the daunting Road America track in Elkhart Lake, Wisconsin.

Scott was the recipient of the MAZDASPEED Motorsports Development Scholarship after winning the 2011 BF Goodrich/Skip Barber National Championship Presented by Mazda. 2011 was a big year for Anderson as he took in the Skip Barber MAZDASPEED Challenge Winter Tour Championship capturing four wins, the Skip Barber Southern Race Series where he grabbed Vice Champion honors with five wins and the Skip Barber Western Race Series Champion securing another four wins. Between the three race series, he claimed 15 pole positions, 19 wins and 39 podium finishes in 56 race starts.

In 2010 Anderson entered the BF Goodrich/Skip Barber National Championship Presented by Mazda as well as the SCCA Rocky Mountain Region where he earned Rookie of the Year taking first place Spec Racer Ford. The move to cars began in 2009 where Anderson finished third in the Skip Barber Western Series with four first place finishes. Like many racers of today, Scott started in karting where he won multiple events over five years in the Rocky Mountain Sprint Series

Anderson was born and raised in one of America's most scenic locals, Fort Collins, Colorado. A mecca for outdoor sports enthusiasts, Anderson has spent many hours running, riding and skiing the surrounding terrain. Scott attended Fossil Ridge High School in Fort Collins and after graduation attended the Colorado Mountain College and Front Range Community College where he studied arts, science and business.

To say that Scott enjoys the outdoors is an understatement. He takes in everything that Colorado has to offer from skiing in the winter to mountain biking in the summer to camping whenever possible. Anderson can also be found with his family and friends on Lake Powell taking in some water-skiing and wake boarding. Scott decided to forgo the family surgical practice early on. The practice is led by Dr. Jim Anderson, a board certified podiatrist, specializing in foot and ankle surgery with an emphasis on Neuropathy testing, treatment and research. The day-to-day operations are run by Adriann Anderson, a nurse and COO of Anderson Podiatry Centers which operates three offices (Fort Collins and Westminster, CO and Cheyenne, WY).

Scott has two sisters Kati, 26, a lifestyle and wellness coach in Denver, Colorado and Kellie, 21, a Junior majoring in Communications and Business at University of Colorado.

Anderson is sponsored by Anderson Podiatry Centers; Laser Therapy, Surgery, and Neuropathy and Hull & Knarr. Anderson is managed by Derek Daly Academy, led by former Formula One driver Derek Daly.
